1. Fibre Art Handbags - Tutor Chris McGuigan Let your imagination go wild with this very handy handbag which is easy to make and fabulous to wear. Chris has many years of creative sewing with a background in costume design and teaching. You will learn quilting, binding, piping and decorating techniques to come away with an original.

Bring Sewing machine and zipper foot (cleaned and in good order), scissors, pins, thread. 3 quilt weight fabrics 70cm main (112cm wide) - 60cm lining 30cm pocket, tape measure, masking tape 1 inch wide or sewing guide attachment, tailors chalk, hand sewing needles, embellishments for bag eg, lace, buttons, embroidery, extension cord and multibox (opt).

2. Whakairo Wheua Bone Carving – Tutor Sean Delany Bone carving is an ancient form of art for Maori. Over 2 mornings, cut, round, sand and polish a Hei matau pendant, (traditional Maori fish hook) with a plaited string and toggle. Sean Delany makes beautiful taonga both modern and traditional out of bone and welcomes you to the workshop to share his knowledge and this experience with you.

You will learn key points to consider, like connection with subject, lighting, background and positioning and practise them. Oliver especially loves photographing people to get that special moment of connection and has been a professional photographer for many years all over the world. 11. Harakeke Pikau – Backpack – Tutor Atawhai Teaukura This is a small class for weavers with experience. You will have a lesson on looking after, collecting and flax preparation on the Saturday for 1 hour at 1pm (car pool from Rec centre) and on Sunday will come with your flax prepared and ready to weave.

12. Harakeke Beginners – Tutor Atawhai Teaukura This class is open to all people wanting to learn the art of Maori flax weaving. It will start with some basic flowers and then move gently onto kono and small 2 corner kete. You will learn the tikanga of flax whilst weaving. Atawhai began weaving as a child, learning from her Aunty Irene Walker in Nuhaka; her whakapapa is Ngati Kahungungu and Ngati Porou me Rongomai Wahine.
